Resolution No. 13 RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES RECOGNIZING JUNE 19 AS JUNETEENTH

WHEREAS, Juneteenth commemorates the effective end of slavery in the United States and is also known as Emancipation Day, Freedom Day, and Juneteenth Independence Day; and

WHEREAS, on June 19, 1865, Union soldiers, led by Major General Gordon Granger, landed at Galveston, Texas with news that the war had ended and that the enslaved were now free, more than two years after President Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation; and

WHEREAS, Juneteenth is a day on which honor and respect is paid for the sufferings of slavery. It is a day on which we acknowledge the evils of slavery and its aftermath. On Juneteenth, we talk about our history and realize because of it, there will forever be a bond between us; and

WHEREAS, recognizing Juneteenth as a celebration of freedom promotes appreciation of African American history and culture, and encourages continuous self-development and respect for all cultures; and

WHEREAS, the recognition of Juneteenth emphasizes the value and dignity of every person and affirms the commitment to respect the human rights of all people. Locally, the efforts of Juneteenth Santa Barbara has highlighted local historical achievements and education on June 14, 2025 at Plaza Del Mar/Pershing Park; and

WHEREAS, Santa Barbara City College recognizes the importance of celebrating Juneteenth not only as a past reflection, but also as a present opportunity to promote racial equity, unity, and cultural understanding among all members of the community; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Santa Barbara Community College District hereby declares June 19 as "Juneteenth" at Santa Barbara City College and encourages all educational departments and members of the community to observe and celebrate this day with appropriate programs, ceremonies, and activities that honor the history and contributions of African Americans.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution be distributed to all college departments and be made available to the press and public to enhance community awareness and participation.
